1 Summary Sheet

Location: Giralia Station, in between Coral Bay and Exmouth, Western Australia.

Accommodation type: Four+, 4m and 5m Glamping Bell Tents.

What you will love:

- The tranquility and the stunning sunrises and sunsets over a 360 degree view of the Australian Outback.
- Inspiring off-grid setup on top of red sand dunes
- Food: Campfire meals cooked on locally sourced wood
- Service: We have staff available to do things for you like cooking, playing with the kids, teaching bushcraft skills etc.

Room: Each room has a chill zone, fireplace/grill and a private toilet cubicle with a port-a-potti (supplemented by new toilet and shower block at the homestead).

2 Australian Savannah Glamping

Rising up from the deep red sand dunes, for the first time in this outback area, are 4 glamping tents brought to you by Wild Cleanse (Perth) and the historic Giralia station. Wake up to spectacular sunrises, eat slow cooked food on campfires as you watch the sunsets with a glass of wine or three and sleep just after watching a star filled sky. Our camp is completely-off grid but we are providing you with all the infrastructure to have a relatively luxurious experience. Comfortable beds in an awesomely lit glamping tent, with your own fire pit+grill, various chill zones, upcycled furnishing from the local "yard" and fulfilling meals, slow cooked over a campfire for you. Just sit back and enjoy the outback far away from the overcrowded tourist areas.

3 Philosophy: Off Grid and Glamping

Off grid living is a chance to wean ourselves from everything we take for granted, disconnect ourselves from the quiet infiltration of connectivity and go back to a time when life was simpler.

However, the Australian Outback is a harsh and unforgiving place. In designing our glamping experience, we wanted a balance between making it an awesome experience where you don't have to do anything but still be in tune with living in nature in a remote area; and to us that means a degree of self-reliance.

4 Accommodation

We have four Australian-sourced, 4m and 5m sized bell tents, well spaced from each other. The 5m bell tents can fit in a family of up to 4 people. Interior décor is aimed at luxury with bamboo mattress toppers, cotton bedding, Thai triangle pillows, tables and a pleasing overall look and feel. We are proud to provide you with an amazing nights sleep

5 Things to do

Its wildflower season, so the whole landscape is stunning. Star gazing here is another level as the Milky Way is very clearly seen without all the light pollution. With our own mangroves, creek and a beach, Giralia is popular with fisher(wo)men. Please bring your snorkels, kayaks, off road bicycles, SUP, fishing, crabbing and other sporting gear. Manu can teach you cooking and the basics of partner acrobatics (acro yoga, nothing to do with yoga) and welcome to join in for some volleyball or calisthenics.

If you want to make some art, there is the station tip with a car graveyard that is full of interesting stuff

Since Exmouth and Coral bay are driving distance you can easily nip up there for the whale shark tour or reef snorkelling.

Staff are available at \$40ph for general assistance, cooking, entertaining your kids with Bushcraft skill sessions etc. Kids will love the campfire popcorn, marshmallows and playing in the sand dunes.

6 Site Location

The camp is located on sand dunes ~1km from the Giralia homestead. As you drive in, check-in and out at the homestead and get your directions! The homestead has a new shower and toilet block for its camping and caravan-ing customers that you are welcome to use. There is also a small kitchen with a small fridge.

7 Infrastructure

7.1 Power

Each tent has a power station for lights, USB outlets and an outlet for small household electonics. The camp itself can charge and operate other household devices.

7.2 Mobile and Internet

Out here in the periphery, only Telstra works. A hotspot can be setup by request. The signal is better at the homestead and limited at the camp.

7.3 Water

The Homestead has borewell water that is unsuitable for drinking. We have limited water available at the camp. It would be amazing if you can please bring water for your own shower, which can be collected on the site.

7.4 Refrigeration

For stays over two days we can organize ice but we request people to bring their own esky and ice.

7.5 Laundry

There is a laundry available at the homestead and costs \$4 per load.

7.6 Garbage

Please take all your garbage out with you. In the campsite, we have a bin for wet waste that is composted, the rest of it is plastic, bottles, cans etc that you have to take out with you and please keep the boxes they came in.

8 Shower

We have an aqua heat portable shower for you to heat up your water for a hot shower. Again, you can use our cubicle or one at the homestead.

9 Toilet

Each tent has its own private toilet cubicle decorated with some stylish, upcycled country-home stuff we were gifted by the owners. One aspect of off-grid living is managing your "black water". You have a choice of using the new toilet block at the homestead 1km away, use our port-a-potti or bring one with you. The port-a-potti comes with liquids to manage the sewage so that it does not smell.

10 Food

10.1 Gourmet Campfire meals

Each night a campfire meal is prepared by the camp host. Cost \$35 per head. All meals can be cooked for you by the camp host at a cost of \$40 per hour for a family of four. Please organize with the host in advance because perishables (salad, veg, meats) have to be pre-ordered unless you bring it with you.

10.2 BYO

Feel free to bring and cook your own food. There is a basic camp kitchen with gas burners, cooking pots/pans and utensils for you to use. Alternately use your private campfire pit and grill. There is some wood available on site which is fun to collect but feel free to bring your own.

Grocery/Restaurants/shops: The nearest IGA's/Restaurants are 1+ hr away in Coral Bay and Exmouth. So best to bring everything with you.

11 Wildlife

11.1 Flora & Fauna

Welcome to the Australian outback. With the recent rains, expect to see some beautiful wildflowers. Even the spinifex is green!

Kangaroos, Emus, all kinds of goannas and mud crabs live on this site and there are still a few cattle wandering around. We haven't seen snakes and spiders but they are around. They wont disturb you if you don't disturb them. There is however an indemnity form to sign as you are in the raw Australian outback.

11.2 Pests

There aren't many flies in winter but there are some mosquitoes and midgies. A repellent is recommended as is sunscreen.

11.3 Pets

Pets are allowed on the property just not allowed in the tents due to the potential for mess and damage

12 What do I need to bring?

- While we want to spoil you, we request you to be self sufficient with water, ice, esky and obviously drinks and alcohol. For longer stays we can provide ice.
- Eco-friendly/Biodegradable Soaps and Shampoos to keep the grey water nutritious.
- Food and snacks especially for lunches though you could pre-order with us. If you can bring
 us some lettuce and salad leaves, we will appreciate that, since these are hard for us to keep
 fresh!
- Cutlery and glasses are provided but please bring your own cooking pots/pans/utensils, teatowels to use with your fire-pits.
- Head torches unless you are happy with your mobile phone light.
- Medicines and Medical Kit
- Sun protective gear. A hat that covers the back of your neck is nerdy but good! Long sleeves and long pants especially for the colder nights.
- Sunscreen, insect repellent and insect bite soother like Stingose.
- Fuel: Though there is limited fuel available for purchase at the homestead.
- Garbage: Get boxes/bags for all your dry waste. Wet waste, we have a composting bin.

13 Weather

Sunny almost every day! The region is relatively warm in the day, hot under the sun but cold at nights. The coast can be extremely windy. Luckily the station is 40km away and has relatively less wind but can still be a bit windy especially in the day time. Even the windy days have times when its absolutely still and is a rare treat for people from Perth!

14 Location & Directions

We are one hours drive from either Coral Bay or Exmouth. On Burkett Rd, the turnoff to the homestead is marked with a sculpture of a man on a fishing boat. It is lit up at night.

14.1 Car Access

There is one (maybe two) sections where a 4WD will get you right up to the camp site. Just needs a bit of speed and skill and you could do it in a regular car. Alternately, park 250m away and the camp host can ferry you and your luggage.

14.2 Directions

Once you get here, ring the bell at the homestead.

14.3 Airport Pickups

Airport pickups and drop offs are available for \$125 each way.

15 Camp host

Unless on leave (unlikely, I work 7 days a week!) your camp host is Manu. Manu was most recently working with Virgin Australia before he quit to start Wild Cleanse, a glamping hire and retreats venture. He has previously worked as an investment banker, built and operated a hotel on an island, owned and operated a restaurant in Sydney and is a good cook. Ask him for a good curry or something spicy for the campfire BBQ.
